Nature of support 2013/14

- Small group / paired tuition, ten week course tailored to individuals working on basic Literacy, Numeracy skills and phonics catch up, delivered by experienced TA.
- Social Communication Classroom Assistant support and Classroom Assistant for nurture group support provided for individuals.
- KS2 Pupil Progress / Feedback meetings attended by PPG children, led by class teacher.
- Assistance as required for educational trips.

Curriculum focus of PPG spending 2013/14

- To increase the percentage of children eligible for PPG to progress 4 points (KS2), 7 point (KS1) over the year in Numeracy.
- To increase the percentage of children eligible for PPG to progress 4 points (KS2), 7 point (KS1) over the year in Literacy.
- To ensure PPG children achieve the phonics end of year pass mark.
- To ensure KS2 PPG children have a good understanding of their individual targets.
- To develop children's self-esteem and speaking and listening skills.
- To increase parents understanding and knowledge of how to help their child with reading, writing and maths at home.

Summary of spending and actions taken so far for September 2013- December 2013

- TA support provided for individuals working on basic Literacy, Numeracy skills
- Class teachers released for KS2 Pupil Progress / Feedback meetings
- nurture group support provided for individuals
- Assistance provided for educational visits/visitors.



Further spending and actions for January 2014- April 2014

- Continue to provide TA support for individuals working on basic Literacy, Numeracy skills and extend to phonics catch up.
- Class teachers release again for KS2 Pupil Progress / Feedback meetings
- Further develop Social Communication support and nurture group support for individuals
- Continue assistance as required for educational trips
- Develop a 'Home learning club' including resources
